

- 1. To reach underserved populations of Washtenaw County with early literacy messages
- 2. To improve the school readiness of children ages 0-5 years old
- 3. Market free early literacy events to these groups
- 4. Use 3 years of pilot program to develop a service other libraries can and will use







Parent messaging is key

- Parents are a child's first and best teacher
- Research-based, parent-approved content impacts parent behaviors for early intervention leading to school success
- Text messages reach parents anywhere
- Messages demonstrate early learning is easy and fun
- Need to improve school readiness and school success in Michigan

Talking is Teaching https://talkingisteaching.org/ currently available in Wayne and Livingston Counties as well as Northern Michigan, but is working in partnership with the Michigan Department of Education and Great Start Collaborative on a statewide rollout

- Reviewed by the very parents libraries struggle to reach
- Making non-users aware of the library through TALK will benefit the entire family

New Features

- Improved messaging platform to accommodate more users
- Anyone can sign up, but libraries who opt in will be able to reach users in their area with customized event and service information
- Potential Spanish expansion
- Statewide training for library staff and access to a toolkit of materials to use for advertising and outreach
