






#### Someone has thought about this before.

A secondary source is anything that discusses, summarizes, identifies, explains, or analyzes primary authorities AND/OR helps someone to identify legal issues AND/OR helps to understand how the law works AND/OR provides a roadmap of how to deal with the problem AND/OR even answers the question!

(not all secondary sources are created equal)


The goal of broad initial secondary research is to find the language and context for more specific searches.



#### Do you book or do you Google? \*

- The object here is to find terminology or words most likely used in primary legal authorities by finding a site that uses everyday language and associates it to those more formal terms.
- Books for laypeople on a legal topic (Nolo)
- Open-minded approach: go for news sources like MLive, public radio, local news (including government meeting minutes)
- Social media: what's got your researcher worried?
- If you think you might know the source of the law, try using "MCL" or "USC" as a search term.

#### No place for popups: Sifting through the noise

### You want a resource that's CURRENT and COHERENT and maybe even leads to PRIMARY AUTHORY

- May be found by using .org, .edu, .net in the search
- <u>Advocacy groups</u>
- University-sponsored <u>websites</u> or <u>clinics</u>
- Publications produced by non-profits
- <u>Professional organizations</u>
- The Good Dot Coms <u>law firm blogs and presentations</u> and trade groups
- Put them through the <u>CRAAP test</u>





#### Docket search example for a Michigan circuit court




