Capital Area District Libraries offers a variety of trainings for professional development days to help educators learn about new resources teachers and students can use in the classroom. Each training is listed with the minimum number of hours, but trainings can be extended based on the needs of participants. Each one hour of training can be state-approved for one SCECH if scheduled at least one month in advance. Trainings can also be combined in a single day. Refreshments may be provided if requested. Optionally, most trainings (not all) can be offered via Zoom.
