Student Success Initiative (SSI) Cards

The card number is created by adding the student username to the letters DAN. For example: **dantr1234**

Basic Facts:

- All students enrolled in Dansville Schools are eligible for a free card.
- The student does not have to live in Ingham County.
- The student can have both a full access Youth CADL card and an SSI card. These accounts are separate, so checkouts on one will not count toward the checkout limit on the other.
- To place items on hold and use digital resources create a password at cadl.org.
- To check out items at any of our 13 branches or Mobile Library, the student can show their school ID card or give the account number to staff.
- Account notices will be sent to the student's school email address. Contact information and notice preference can be updated at cadl.org/account.

Account Rules:

- CADL does not charge overdue fines, but students and their parents/guardians are responsible for returning items. If an item reaches 10 days overdue the account is blocked until the item is returned. Items not returned within 30 days of the due date will be billed to the student.
- Parents/guardians have permission to obtain account information. They must be able to provide their student's school username.

What you can do with an SSI card:

- Use the public computers in any CADL branch.
- Check out five physical items at a time. This includes Student Success hotspots, books, audiobooks on CD, read-along books, and print magazines. SSI cards cannot be used to check out Library of Things items, DVDs and BluRays, music CDs or use MeLCat interlibrary loan.
- Check out digital items such as **OverDrive** ebooks, audiobooks and magazines; **hoopla** ebooks, graphic novels, audiobooks, music albums and movies; **Kanopy** movies and documentaries, including **Kanopy Kids** and **BookFlix**.
- Use databases such as the video learning platform **LinkedIn Learning**, **Consumer Reports**; directory information from **Reference Solutions**; genealogy information from **Ancestry.com**; and newspaper databases.
- Access tutoring services through **tutor.com**. Live tutors are available from 2-9 pm daily, with drop-off review options and test preparation tutorials from the Princeton Review also available.
- Use services available to CADL members through the Michigan Electronic Library, such as **Learning Express** test preparation.
