






Favorite Prime Time Book: Too Many Tamales By Gary Soto




Favorite Prime Time book: The Big Orange Splot by Daniel Manus Pinkwater

You are invited to attend PRIME TIME FAMILY READING TIME®, a fun and exciting reading program at the Peter White Public Library. PRIME TIME families will receive tips and tools to help children improve reading skills and enjoy reading together as a family. This year we are expanding this program to include preschool aged children for their own PRIME TIME PRESCHOOL®.

PRIME TIME is a special 6 week program of reading, storytelling, and discussion for parents and their children ages 3-10. The program teaches many simple strategies to help family and friends not only boost a child's reading skills, but also encourage a greater interest in reading. PRIME TIME families will learn how to talk about books in ways that can increase classroom success. The program is free, and transportation assistance, such as cab fare and bus passes, is available.

Programs are presented by a discussion leader and a storyteller who use award-winning children's books to:

- · Encourage parents and children to read and talk about books as a family activity
- · Identify and discuss the ideas and values in children's books
- Teach parents and children how to choose books and use library resources


