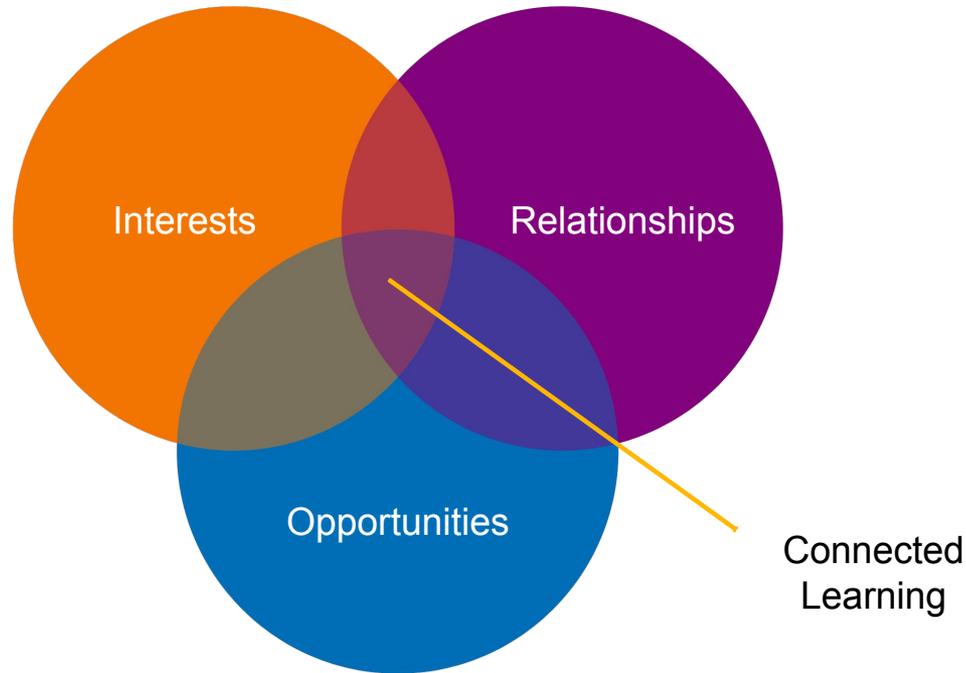

Elements of Connected Learning

The research is clear: Learning is irresistible and life-changing when it connects personal interests to meaningful relationships and real-world opportunity.



Six Principles of Connected Learning



- Interest-Powered
- Production Centered
- Peer Supported
- Shared Purpose
- Academically Oriented
- Openly-Networked

So why should CL matter to you?

- Your job is to bring teens into your library and engage them.
- You want to inspire teens in your community and see them succeed.
- You wish to connect with teens.
- You're tired.
- You feel too “old” to interact with teens.
- You are questioning your “Why.”

Connecting with Teens

In-library

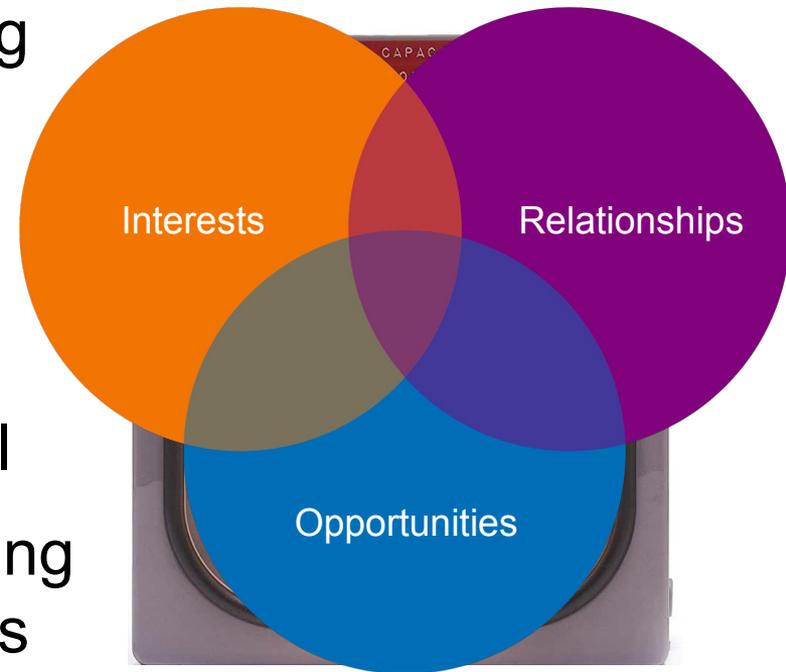
- Library experiences
- Work to fill NHS Hours (volunteering)
- Community Scanning Day

Outreach

- Train teens to use equipment & form a local history club at HS
- Introduction to local history at Boys & Girls Clubs

Connecting the Pieces

- Connect with who is already doing this work, either officially or unofficially, in library and the community
- Bring together youth librarians, teens, and local history personnel
- Offer training on connected learning and teen behavior to these groups



Chicago's YOUmedia

“Space is powerful – open space more so for teens. We don’t want them to feel constrained. We want them to be empowered to try any activity or be comfortable enough to hang around,” explains Jeremy Dunn, Director of Teen Services.

Connected Learning in Action

Flint Public Library's "Flint Teen Researchers"

- Digitizing fragile materials
- Preserving & organizing
- Indexing



Transcribing WPA Cards and sorting materials

Flint Teen Researchers - Outcomes

- Introduced to collections and services of which they were not aware!
- Enriched their knowledge of their community and their own family history.
- Gained research and library skills.

Digitization Kits

Why borrow a kit?

- Small, contained projects
- Special event
- Special formats
- Getting your feet wet
- Try equipment before purchase

What's in the kit?

- Scanner (and adapters)
- Laptop
- Color guide & grayscale
- Mouse & surge protector
- OCR Software
- Photo Editing Software

Digitization Kits | Two Models

Epson V600 Perfection

- 6400 ppi optical resolution
- Captures 48-bit color
- 8.5" x 11.7" scan surface
- Good for scanning:
 - Loose documents
 - Photographic prints
 - Photographic slides & negatives

Plustek A300 Plus

- 600 ppi optical resolution
- Captures 48-bit color
- 12" x 17" (A3) scan surface
- Good for scanning:
 - Large documents
 - Bound material

Digitization Kits | FAQ

- | | | |
|---|---|-------------------|
| How long can I keep it? | ➔ | Two (2) months |
| How do I get the kit? | ➔ | Kits ship via UPS |
| Can it be used for community scanning days? | ➔ | Yes! |
| How much does it cost? | ➔ | Free! |

Resources - Funding

Improving Access to Information Grant

- Ideal for projects that engage local communities in the collection, documentation, and preservation of their local histories, experiences, and identities
- Can be used for in-house or vendored digitization
- Eligible public and academic libraries
- Must share metadata with DPLA
- Call for applications is open NOW
- Award range \$5,000-25,000

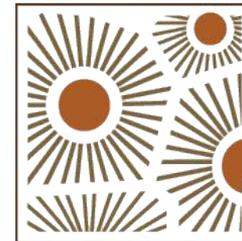


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Resources - Infrastructure

LM Digital Hosting

- Free, flexible digital collections hosting
- Any amount, (almost) any format
- From or about Michigan or Great Lakes region
- Transcription required for ADA compliance
- Minimum metadata requirements
- Must share metadata with DPLA
